We will showcase our highland dancing students and the steps/dances they have learned during the 2022-2023 year.

1. INSTRUCTIONS To participate in this dance out. Students must:

- have their hair pulled back into a bun (use gel and hairspray to tame loose ends);
- remove any jewelry;
- wear a clean black body suit;
- wear clean white knee socks;
- wear highland ghillies (or other black ballet slippers they use for class);
- wear a huge smile and have fun!

2. NSOHD has plaid red circle skirts/ kilts for all of the dancers to borrow for this event.

PRIMARY DANCERS: During classes on May 23rd, we will be labelling, pinning and temporarily adjusting skirts to fit each little dancer.

SENIOR DANCERS: Will be wearing loaned kilts that have already been fitted to them. Please be aware that there must be absolutely <u>NO</u> food or drink (other than water) around the kilts.


